Welcome to the 51st Tour of Homes! This map will guide you to this year’s spectacular locations. The Tour dates back to 1972, when neighborhood pioneers opened their homes during the first Inman Park Festival, eager to generate interest in Inman Park and to convince bankers, insurers, and politicians that the run-down, red-lined neighborhood was safe for investment. The Festival, which for many years brought in most of its income from house-tour ticket sales, became even more important in the 1980s, when a coalition of neighborhoods fought the Georgia Department of Transportation’s plan to build a six-lane highway through Inman Park and other historic in-town neighborhoods. Although many fine houses in the freeway’s path had already been demolished, Festival proceeds helped fund successful legal battles that guaranteed neighborhood input into the design of Freedom Parkway and preserved the remaining threatened areas. We think the results were well worth the expense and effort. We hope you agree.

Rolling up my sleeves with my fellow committee members working toward a common goal has been very rewarding and satisfying. Inman Park has always been at the vanguard of civic and urban planning. And in that same tradition of being on the forefront and breaking barriers, I am proud to serve as the festival’s first African American chair since its inception 51 years ago. My observation from the vantage point of festival chair has been a validation of the saying, “Diversity is one of our greatest strengths.” Diversity in thoughts and ideas, diversity in viewpoints and, yes, diversity of the people making the decisions in the room where it happens. This has indeed always been one of our greatest strengths. This is true for our neighborhood, our city, and our nation. So welcome to the 51st Inman Park Festival. Welcome everyone.
